



## **Voting Record – FY2010 Congressional Budget Resolution**

The budget resolution serves as a blueprint for federal spending and provides Congress with some control over the appropriations process. No new spending authority, however, is provided until appropriations bills are enacted. A budget resolution binds Congress but is not law, so it does not require the President's signature. Both the House and Senate are responsible for drafting their respective budget resolutions and then agreeing to a final resolution voted on in both chambers. In sum, the budget resolution acts as a guideline for the division of finances among committees and subcommittees of the House and Senate and is divided among functional accounts.

The FY 2010 Budget Resolution for Function 500, which includes education funding, includes \$89.4 billion in discretionary funding for Function 500 for Education, Training, Employment and Social Services. This is a \$5.6 billion increase above FY09 levels.

**Voting Record – FY 2009 Omnibus Appropriations Bill**

An appropriation bill is used to provide money to discretionary or non-entitlement programs. According to the constitution, all appropriations bills must originate in the House, while the Senate usually drafts its own version and is later amended to incorporate the stipulations of the House version. In the FY 2009 omnibus appropriations bill, the discretionary total for Labor, HHS, and Education was \$7.4 billion, or 5 percent, more than the fiscal 2008 level. The law provides \$62.6 billion in discretionary funds for the Department of Education, \$3.4 billion more than the fiscal 2008 level or an increase of 5.8 percent.

Passage of the omnibus bill was a victory for the education community after President Bush threatened to veto any legislation that increased his funding request for FY 2009, which flat funded the Department of Education’s budget and proposed eliminating 47 education programs. Refusing to cut education funding, House Appropriations Chairman, David Obey (D-WI) decided to wait until a new administration was in the White House to submit the FY 2009 spending bill for the president’s signature. President Barack Obama signed this legislation March 11, 2009
