



## I. Policy Intelligence and Education News

- **State allocations of Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund and Governors Fund** – Last week the Department of Education posted [state allocations for the \\$54.3 billion of K-12 support funding](#) in December's COVID-relief supplemental funding bill. Private K-12 schools are eligible for another \$2.75 billion that is part of the \$4.05 billion total given to governors to allocate, so it's likely the remaining \$1.3 billion will also go to public K-12 schools. We will share the allocations for the higher education fund once we see them.
- **Education and Labor Committee: staff opening, staff vacancy, and new Members** – [Kathy Valle is the new Education Policy Director for the House Education and Labor Committee](#) following the departure of Jacque Chevalier Mosely. House Republicans have not announced new committee assignments as they are pushing for a change in the ratios give the change in the size of the Democratic House majority.
