I. Timing of and Briefing on the President's FY 2022 Budget release tomorrow

- **Budget materials to be released in the afternoon** – We're hearing that the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) will post the [President's full fiscal year \(FY\) 2022 budget materials online](#) tomorrow around 1:30pm ET. The Department of Education (ED) anticipates posting its customary budget materials – the Congressional Justifications that detail programmatic and funding data for each program, and the summary document – by mid-afternoon. Other agencies are also likely to post their own materials after the OMB budget is public. I will send around links as soon as I see them.
- **ED budget briefing tomorrow at 3:25pm** – In a change from its original plan, ED will hold a short conference call briefing on the President's budget tomorrow at 3:25pm ET. The advisory from ED is reprinted below, including a registration link.
