Share Your Story of Why Education Funding Matters to You and Urge Congress to Support Investments in Education

Why this matters now

• Education funding is in jeopardy. Some want to eliminate the Department of Education while others are pushing to drastically cut its funding. The new Administration has unilaterally canceled and withheld funding Congress specifically provided for education research, teacher training, and more. Department of Education funding is already more than \$16 billion BELOW the 2011 level in inflation-adjusted dollars. Federal education funding helps all students – the main K-12 education program helps more than 90% of school districts hire teachers and purchase supplies, supporting both jobs and students. Special Education funding provides more than 7 million students with services and support they need, freeing up state and local education funding for other purposes. The Rural Education program funds small and low-income schools that face extra costs due to their location and size, and other programs focus on specific needs, types of schools, or students seeking career and academic skills to launch them into the future. Now is the time to urge Congress to invest in education, not cut it! It's #Time4EdFunding

What you can do

 experience in the education community (your school, college, child care, or other education-related program). Tell
 Congress how a greater federal investment in education would make a big difference (see sample message below).

Sample message to record or write out

Facts about education funding:

- Congress is working on funding bills for this year, so now is the time to make your voice heard!
- Congress needs to insist that the Administration provide the education funding that Congress enacted.
- Education investments support jobs in school districts, vital services for all students, and provides access to postsecondary education and workforce development.
- Funding for the Department of Education was stagnant for years, and was cut last year to a level that is \$16 billion below the 2011 level in inflation-adjusted dollars.
- Investments in education account for only about two percent of the regular federal budget, yet those investments have vital immediate and long-term returns that benefit society as a whole.
