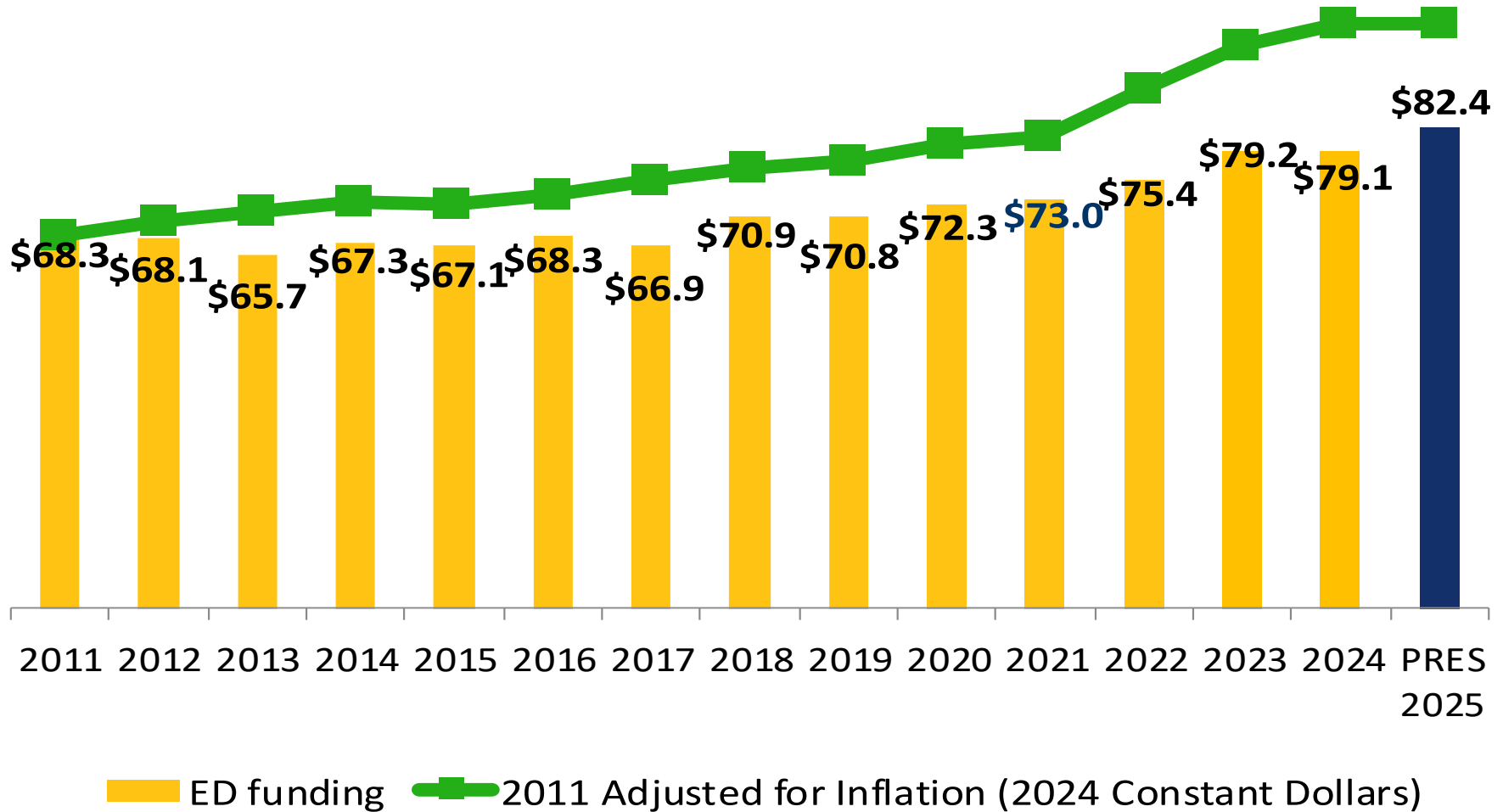


# President's FY 2025 Budget Increases Education Funding, But Total Remains Below the 2011 Inflation-Adjusted Level

(Department of Education Discretionary Funding in Billions of Dollars)



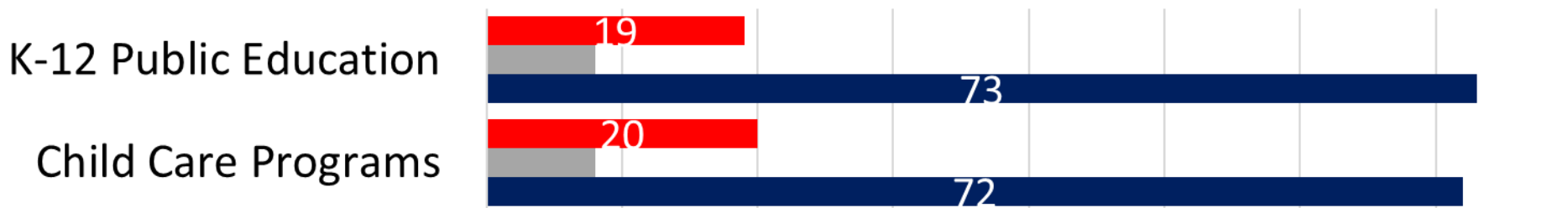

How do you feel about **CUTTING** federal fund for the following?



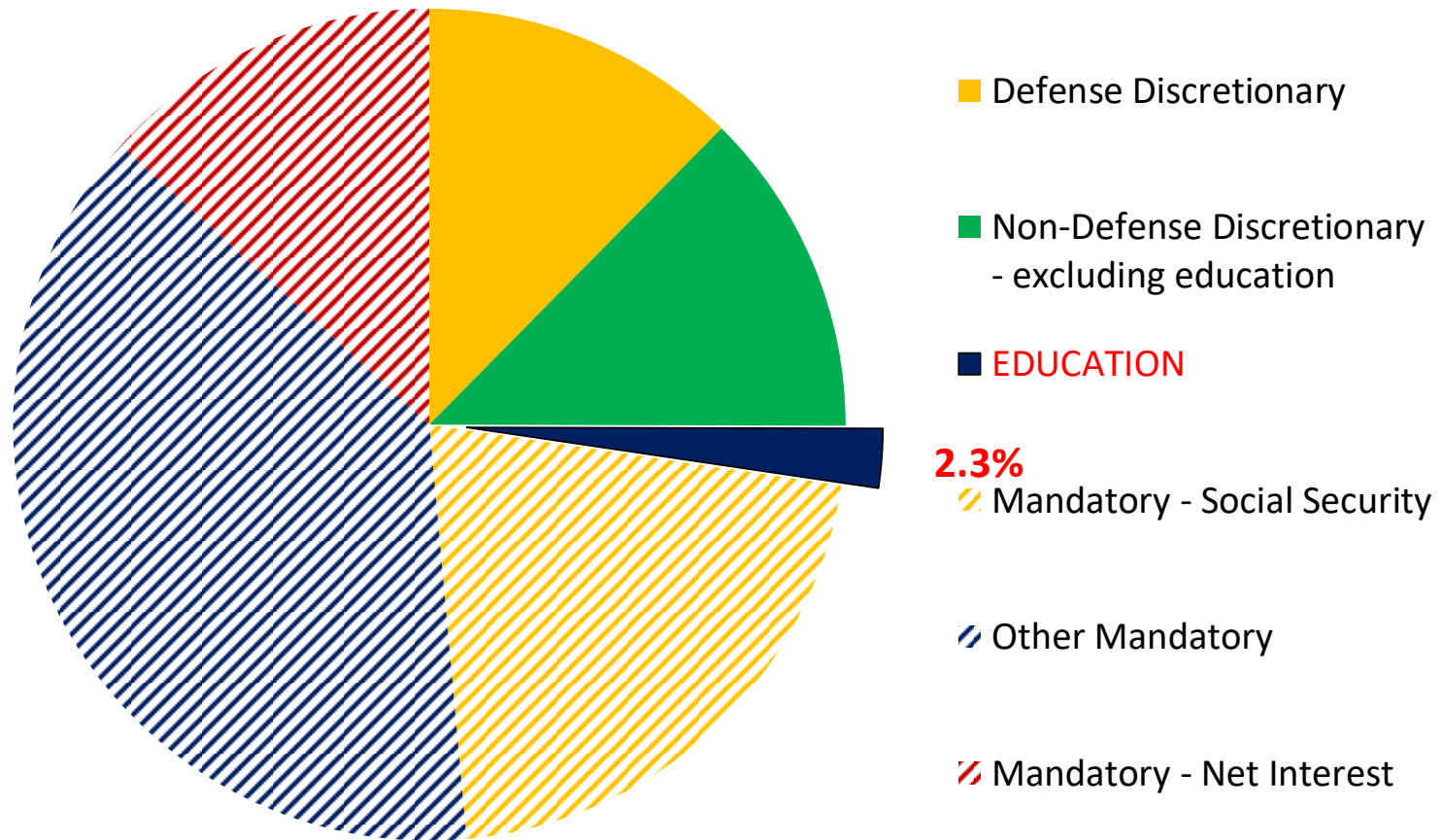
Do you support or oppose **INCREASING** federal funds for the following?

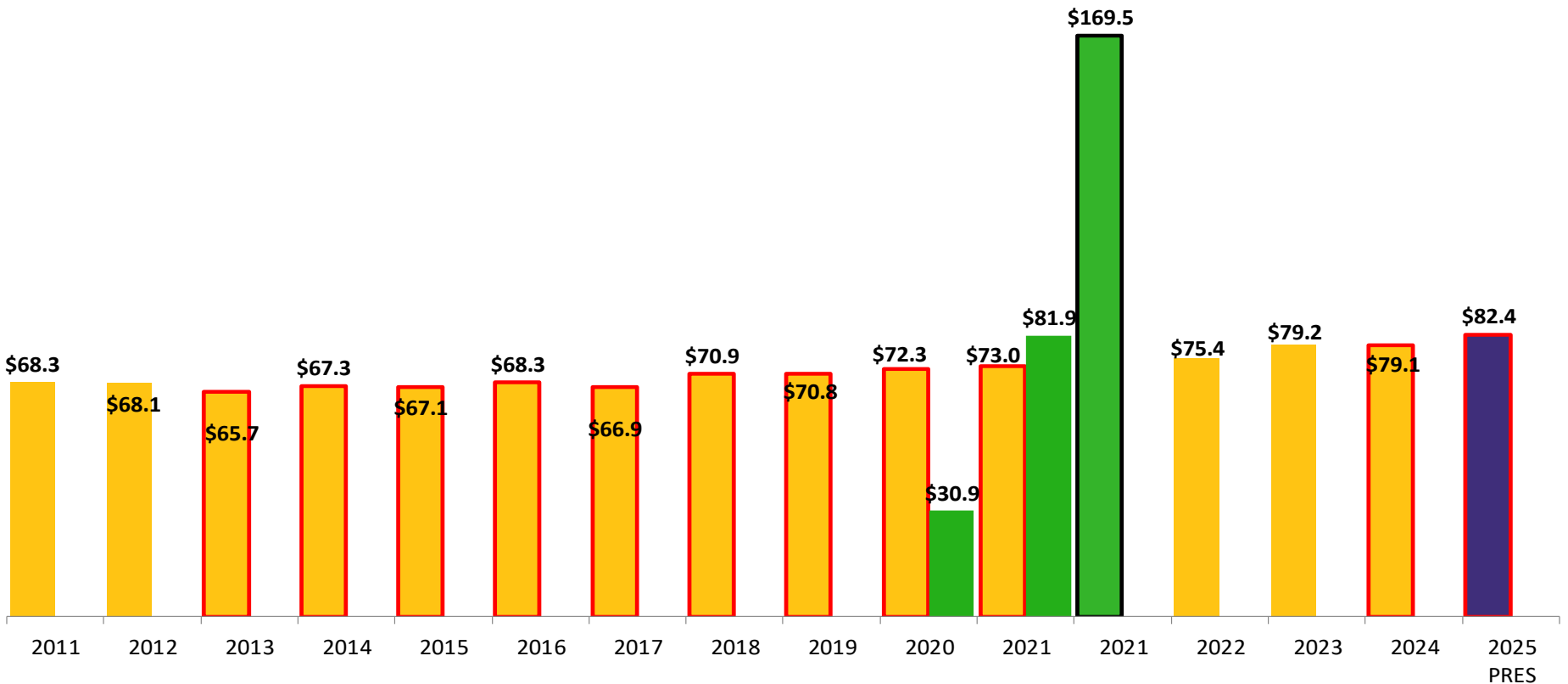
# Education Accounts for 2.3% of President's 2025 Budget

■ Regular ED Funding

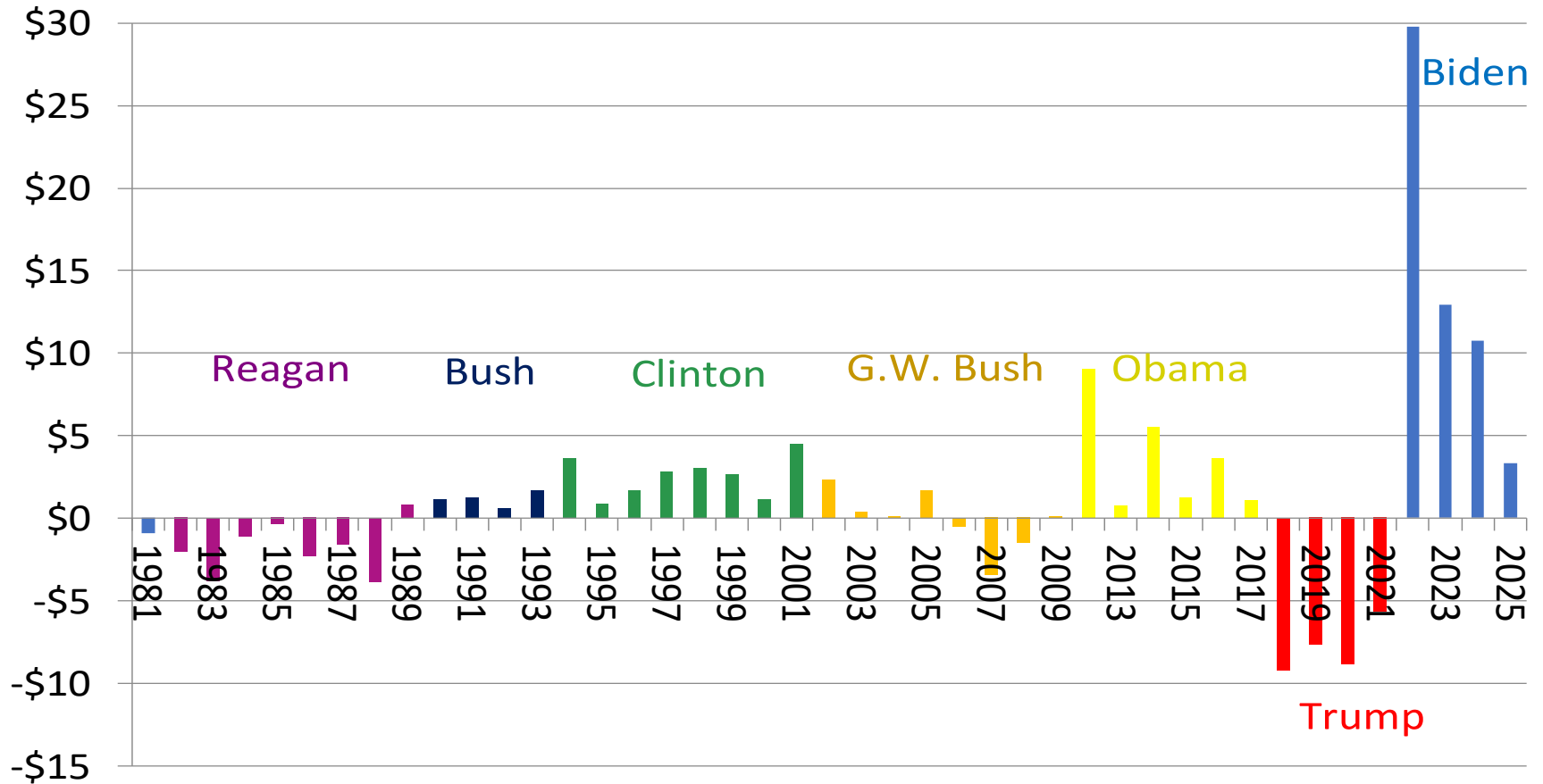
■ Emergency Relief (2020 CARES Act & 2021 COVID relief)

## Increase in Education Funding

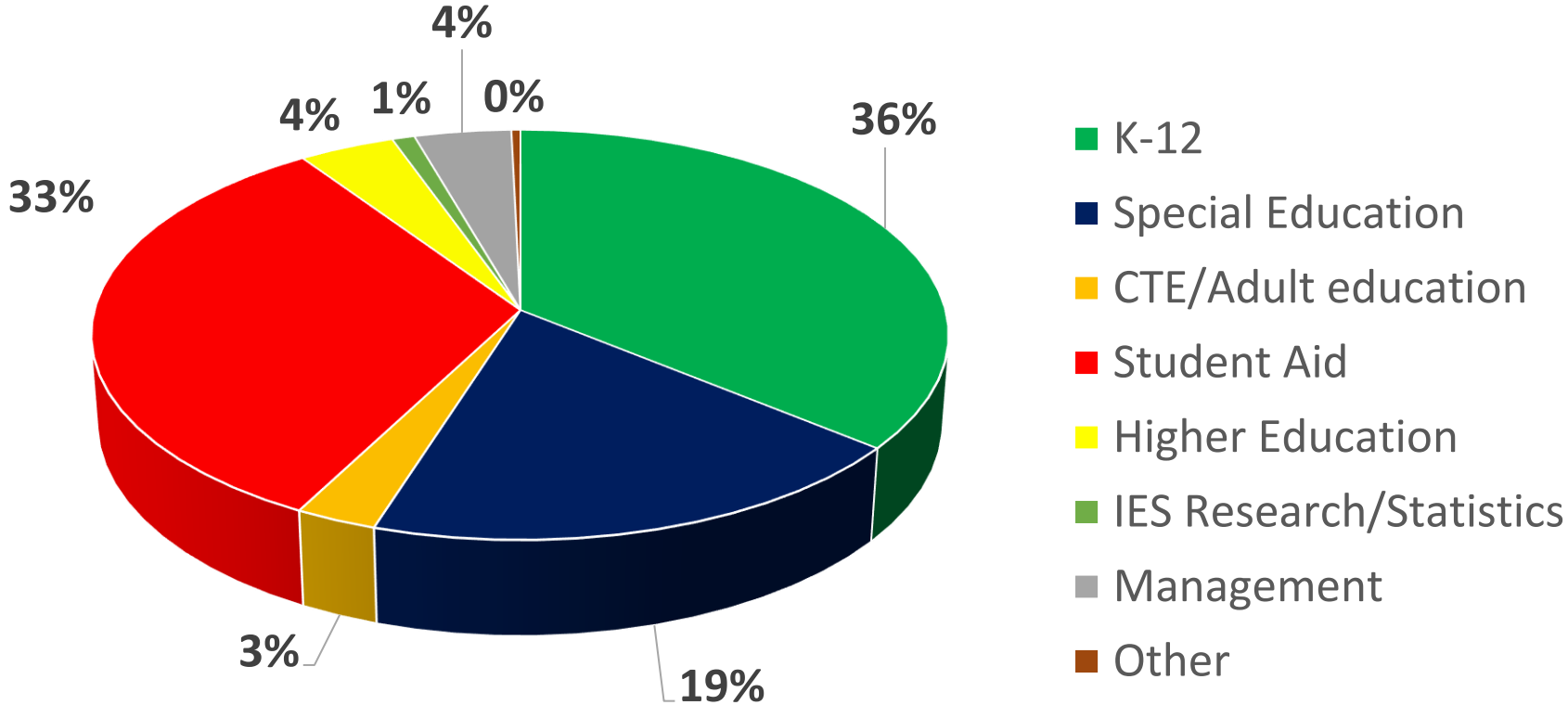
Requested change in Dept. of Education regular discretionary funding vs. prior year, in billions
