
President's FY 2025 Budget Increases Education Funding, But Total Remains Below the 2011 Inflation-Adjusted Level



Do you support or oppose INCREASING federal funds for the following?





Apart from Emergency Relief, Education Funding Held Mostly Flat under Spending Caps in Effect from 2013-2021 and 2024-2025



Requested change in Dept. of Education regular discretionary funding vs. prior year, in billions


