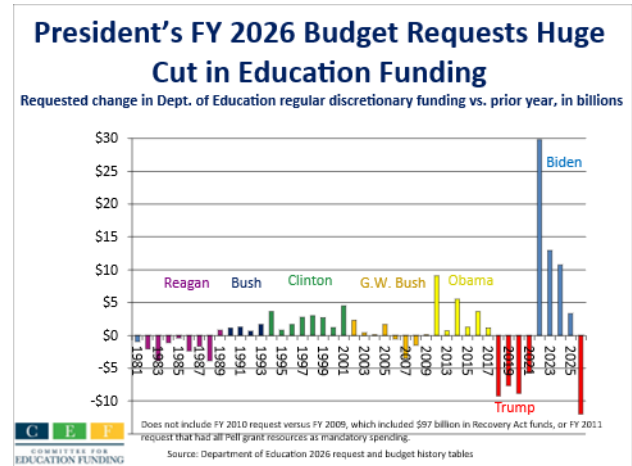
President Trump's Budgets Proposed to Eliminate Many Education Programs

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The Trump Administration's five budgets requested the steepest cuts in education funding and oversight that have ever been proposed, with cuts across the education continuum. Congress largely ignored the first four budgets, but since then the House Appropriations Committee has approved education funding proposals for fiscal year (FY) 2024 and 2025 that included even deeper cuts – cuts that have not been enacted, but all provide an outline of what might be ahead for education for FY 2026 and beyond.

The Trump budgets proposed to eliminate whole programs – the complete list starts below – and to steeply cut other investments in education. The FY 2026 budget consolidates most elementary and secondary education programs except for special education and Title I into one block-grant to states and slashes total funding by 69% (\$4.5 billion), which would have eliminated the intent of Congress to focus federal funding to fill gaps where state and local funding was not sufficient. The Trump budgets all eliminated three of the big K-12 programs (to train teachers and school leaders, to provide afterschool programs, and the block grant that consolidated many smaller programs in the 2016 K-12 reauthorization), and many smaller K-12 programs. In higher education, the budgets had steep cuts to student aid and institutional support.

CEF is urging Congress to follow the public's wishes to [support more education funding](#) by strengthening support for education rather than enacting harmful cuts that will undermine the nation's future.
