Universal Pre-K for 3- and 4-year-olds	Unspecified amount for universal pre-K, including \$15 billion for Head Start staff pay and \$7.5 billion for grantees in non-participating states (Ed & Labor)	\$200 billion for a partnership with states to offer free high-quality preschool to all 3- and 4-year-olds, prioritizing high-need areas and benefitting 5 million children.	
Community college	5 years of phasing down federal assistance to provide free community college (cost not specified) (Ed & Labor).	\$109 billion to offer tuition-free community college for all.	\$12 billion for technological and physical infrastructure needs at community colleges and to increase community college access in education “deserts.”

Other college affordability and completion proposals	\$9 billion in FY 2022 for retention and completion grants; for HBCUs, Minority-Serving Institutions and Tribally Controlled Universities. \$1.5 billion for institutional aid and \$2 billion for a new R&D competitive grant program.(Ed & Labor)	\$62 billion for a new program to strengthen student retention at institutions of higher education that serve disadvantaged communities; \$39 billion for HBCUs, Minority-Serving Institutions, Tribally Controlled Universities to provide 2 years tuition-free for students with family income below \$125k, and \$5 billion for institutional aid for these IHEs; \$2 billion for graduate programs for skilled health workers.	
Teacher training	\$1.1 billion for a variety of educator development programs (Ed & Labor)	\$9 billion to train more teachers to address shortages and increase diversity.	
Adult & Career Technical Education	\$3.6 billion for adult education under WIOA and \$4 billion for CTE programs (Ed & Labor)		\$8.7 billion for Expanded Career Pathways for Middle and High School Students, and \$870 million for adult education
School modernization and construction	\$82 billion for K-12 school construction (Ed & Labor)		\$100 billion to upgrade and build new schools, with priority for safety upgrades
Workforce development	\$67.5 billion in Department of Labor workforce development programs, plus \$4.1 billion for Corporation for National and Community Service and other DOL education-related programs (Ed and Labor)		\$100 billion in total: \$40 billion for a new Dislocated Worker Program; \$12 billion to help workers facing the greatest challenges; and \$48 billion in workforce development and worker protections.

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child care	\$15 billion for child care facilities, to raise provider pay, provide info (Ways & Means). \$90 billion plus unspecified amounts for child care grants and provider support (Ed & Labor)	\$225 billion to make child care affordable for low-income families, raise wages for child care workers, and support providers.	\$25 billion for child care facilities
